

VILLAGE OF GEORGETOWN, OHIO

ORDINANCE NO. 1036

AN ORDINANCE DETERMINING SALARIES TO BE PAID TO THE CHIEF AND MEMBERS OF THE VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT OF THE VILLAGE OF GEORGETOWN, OHIO AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Georgetown, Brown County, Ohio, two-thirds (2/3) or more of all members thereof concurring as follows:

SECTION 1. Effective for the calendar year 2006 and thereafter, the yearly salary for the chief of the Village of Georgetown Volunteer Fire Department shall be \$8,500.00

SECTION 2. Effective for the calendar year 2006 and thereafter, the maximum yearly salary for each member of the Georgetown Volunteer Fire Department shall be \$3,500.00 with the actual compensation of each such member to be calculated as follows:

(a) each member shall be paid \$5.00 per meeting attended up to twelve (12) meetings per year; plus

(b) each member shall be paid \$5.00 per drill attended up to twelve (12) drills per year; plus

(c) each member shall be paid a fractional part of \$3,392.00 with the denominator of such fraction being the total number of fire calls per year and numerator of such fraction being the actual number of fire calls answered by such member of the fire department; plus


(d) each member shall be paid the sum of \$1.00 for each fire call answered by such member of the fire department; provided however, that the combined total of (a), (b), (c) and (d) for any member shall not exceed the sum of \$3,500.00 per calendar year.

SECTION 3. Each officer and engineer shall also be paid the additional sum of \$30.00 per year over and above the amounts provided in Section 2.

SECTION 4. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency ordinance necessary for the health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the Village of Georgetown and more particularly for the reason that it is necessary to provide adequate compensation to the members of the fire


department in order to retain and attract competent personnel and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption.
