

ORDINANCE NO. 234

ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. ~~215~~ AND CREATING THE POSITION OF PATROLMAN AND SUPERINTENDENT OF PARKING METERS IN THE VILLAGE OF GEORGETOWN, OHIO, FIXING DUTIES AND SALARY THEREFOR.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Georgetown, Ohio, that:

- SECTION 1: Ordinance No. 215 be, and hereby is amended by abolishing the position and salary of the position of Night Watchman in said Village of Georgetown, Ohio.
- SECTION 2: That there is hereby created the position of Patrolman and Superintendent of Parking Meters in the Village of Georgetown, Ohio.
- SECTION 3: That the duties of Patrolman in said Village are to be such as are ordinarily performed by police officers in keeping the peace, serving writs, warrants, and other duties as from time to time be ordered or assigned by the Mayor and Chief of Police of said Village.
- SECTION 4: That the combined position of Patrolman and Superintendent of Parking Meters shall also carry the duties of collection from the parking meters in the Village of Georgetown, Ohio, not less than once weekly and at such other times as the Mayor of said Village may order; keeping said parking meters in repair and properly wound for the use of the traveling public, and in enforcement of the provisions of law concerning the use of said parking meters.
- SECTION 5: That the hours of duty of said Patrolmen shall be such as may from time to time be ordered and fixed by the Mayor of said Village.
- SECTION 6: That there be, and hereby is fixed the compensation of said combined position of Patrolman and Superintendent of Parking Meters, the sum of \$1800.00 (Eighteen Hundred Dollars) per year, payable ~~twice~~ monthly by the Clerk of said Village. ~~CHIEF~~
- SECTION 7: That there be, and hereby is appropriated the sum of \$1800.00 (Eighteen Hundred Dollars) from the General Fund of said Village for the payment of the salary of said Patrolman and Superintendent of Parking Meters.
- SECTION 8: That there be, and hereby is allowed and granted to both the Chief of Police and the Patrolman a vacation period of twelve (12) days annually with pay, which may be taken by said Chief of Police and said Patrolman at such times or intervals as such Chief of Police or Patrolman may desire, upon due notice to the Mayor of such period of time, and such further vacation periods may be granted by the Mayor as he may deem justified for good cause shown, however, such further periods shall be without pay.

- SECTION 9: That the Mayor of said Village is hereby authorized to appoint a substitute Patrolman or Police officer from time to time as need may arise, and to pay for said services the sum of \$6.00 (~~Five~~ Dollars) per diem for each day actually served, and that there is appropriated from the General Fund of said Village the sum of \$500.00 (Five Hundred Dollars) per year for such purpose.
- SECTION 10: That the salary of said Patrolman and Superintendent of Parking Meters shall be met by payments of one-half of said salary from the General Fund of said Village and one-half of said salary from the Parking Meter Fund of said Village.
- SECTION 11: That there be, and hereby is created a special fund in said Village known as the Parking Meter Fund, into which all moneys from the operation of said parking meters shall be placed, and from which shall be paid 50 per centum of all collections to the Dual Parking Meter Company, until said meters shall be entirely paid for.
- SECTION 12: That the Patrolman and Superintendent of Parking Meters shall give bond in the sum of \$1000.00 (One Thousand Dollars), for the faithful performance of duty and to secure the payments of all moneys collected by him from the parking meters; which bond shall be payable to the Village of Georgetown, Ohio, and shall be paid for from the Parking Meter Funds of said Village.
- SECTION 13: All Ordinances or parts hereof in conflict with this Ordinance, be, and the same hereby are repealed.
- SECTION 14: It is hereby declared that an emergency exists to the public peace and safety of the inhabitants of said Village, and that this Ordinance shall be in effect and operation by law upon its passage.
